

UKRAINE LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Description of the institution

Luhansk National Taras Shevchenko University (LNTSU) (<u>luguniv.edu.ua/?lang=en</u>) is one of the oldest institutions of higher education in Eastern Ukraine and it celebrated the 95th anniversary of its establishment on March 1, 2016. The University grew out of an association of professors in the city of Luhansk that was formed by the Soviet authorities as Teachers' Training Institute in 1921.

Now LNTSU has a reputation as one of Ukraine's most prestigious universities. At present it operates from Starobilsk, the Luhansk Region, where it was forced to relocate due to the war in Donbas.

Luhansk National Taras Shevchenko University embodies 18 principal academic units – 8 institutes: Institute of Economics and Business, Institute of Information Technologies, Institute of Tourism and Technology of Public Service, Institute of Culture and Art, Institute of Postgraduate Education, Institute of Physical Education and Sports; 3 faculties: Faculty of Foreign Languages, Faculty of Ukrainian Philology and Social Communication, Faculty of Natural Sciences and 7 colleges.

The University has ties with higher education institutions around the world, particularly in Europe. It has also partnered with Franklin Pierce University in the United States to offer an MBA program. LTSNU prides itself on being one of the first Ukrainian universities to commit to the Bologna reforms called for by European higher education leaders. The University has been named Ukraine's best higher education institution several times by Ukraine's Ministry of Education and Science. Twice in 2006 and 2011 the University went through the Institutional Evaluation Programme (IEP) performed by the European University Association.

Today Luhansk Taras Shevchenko National University is experiencing difficult times. As a result of military and information aggression in Eastern Ukraine the institution was evacuated and the significant part of material and technical resources, the library collection, the laboratories were left in the occupied territory. However, the University has preserved the considerable human potential and continues to evolve a remaining educational, scientific and socio-cultural center of the East Ukrainian region.

At present Luhansk Taras Shevchenko National University covers more than 360 training directions, specialties and professions. Annually the educational establishment prepares about 10 thousand of specialists for different public activity fields of different levels. The university completely provides the educational sphere of the East regions of our country with highly-qualified employees.
