MyClass Virtual

A myClass Virtual lesson is like any other myClass lesson you attend at the British Council. You will practise your speaking with your teacher and colleagues in real time and do lots of pair and group work; this is what we call Communicative Language Learning.

Of course, just like in any other myClass lesson, you will also practice your listening and reading, and learn lots of new words and grammar.

This very short guide helps you to understand the reason for some basic rules for participation (**What you need to know**) and then provides some technical guidance (**What you need to have**).

What you need to know

Be on the register

As with all myClass lessons, please make sure you have booked your place on the [Online Booking System](#).

If the teacher cannot see your name on the register, they will need to ask you to leave the room!

- TIP Make sure you use your real name for your Zoom account, and when signing in to the lesson. The teacher can then easily check if your name is on the register.

Be seen and be heard

In myClass virtual lessons you need to have a web-cam / camera so that everyone can see you, and you need to be able to hear and speak. If you have ever used Skype, FaceTime or any other video calling app, then you will know what you need because the experience is very similar.

Unfortunately, if the teacher cannot see or hear you, they will need to ask you to leave the room!

- TIP Test your video and mic before the lesson if you are not sure they work (see below).

Be in a quiet place

The great advantage of myClass Virtual lessons is that you can choose where you want to study. For the best experience however, you need to make sure you are somewhere where other people will not interrupt you and where noise is not a problem. Both of these problems can result in a poor learning experience for you, and for the other students.

If the environment you are in is unsuitable and you cannot change it, the teacher will need to ask you to leave the room!

Be properly connected

You are going to need a good and stable internet connection (for exact details see below). A poor connection will mean people may find it hard to hear or see you, and for you to see and hear them. This can be frustrating for everyone and will result in a poor learning experience.

If your internet connection is not good enough, the teacher will need to ask you to leave the room!

Don't forget about the code of conduct

It may be obvious but, please, do remember to behave in the way you would in any other myClass lesson. Although you may be at home, it's important to remember that normal classroom rules still apply.

If you are asked to leave the room

We understand that while you are becoming familiar with the virtual classroom environment and the technology, you may experience some difficulties. If you are asked to leave the classroom because you cannot be seen or heard, or if you have chosen an unsuitable environment, or if you had a poor internet connection, we will refund your credit.



What you need to have

We use Zoom for our myClass Virtual classes. Zoom is a web-conferencing software, which is free for you to use. To join a class, you will need:

1. a computer (or smartphone)
2. a broadband speed internet connection
3. headphones (optional) – they will help with the quality of sound
4. a built-in or standalone microphone – you will need to speak and be heard!
5. a webcam (you need to be seen!)
6. the meeting room code for the virtual lesson (check the 'Room' on your booking confirmation, on the myClass app or on the OBS).

Please note the unusual lesson duration: **105 minutes**. The first 15 minutes are for you to test your connection and equipment and to make sure you are comfortable in the virtual environment. The teacher will use this time to share the lesson handouts, take the register and welcome you to the class. The teaching will begin after the first 15 minutes and will take **90 minutes**, just like any regular myClass lesson.
